## 1. Oceanside Transit Center Redevelopment – Update and Input Opportunity\*

The Committee will be updated on additional input we have provided to NCTD and the Toll Brothers on the OTC Redevelopment Project, including a follow-up letter submitted for the CEQA Scoping Session held on February 1, copy included with this Agenda. We have also arranged for a representative of the Toll Brothers to attend our meeting and receive input on the proposal. Please come prepared to ask questions and provide input about the proposal, especially from an active transportation and pedestrian access perspective.

#### 2. North County Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan (CMCP)

In August 2022, the Committee received a presentation from SANDAG staff on the CMCP, which was then in development. At that time, completion of the Coastal and Inland Rail Trails were anticipated to be included in the earliest phase of priority projects in the Plan. Caltrans and SANDAG have now released this Draft Plan for public review and comment. The Committee will review the highlights of the Plan's recommendations as they relate to active transportation and will provide direction on proposed comments for a comment letter to be submitted before the March 12 comment deadline.

#### 3. Follow-up: Cycling Safety Improvements on Highway 76

Staff will update the Committee on the Caltrans status of the safety improvements identified two years ago for Highway 76.

1	BikeShare Programs: -Coastal cities' joint BikeShare programs -SANDAG's guidelines development -Oceanside's ordinance	08/22/22 - Tim Pirkey of Encinitas Bcycle attended meeting and provided background on that program. Howard stated the Encinitas program is an excellent one to model Oceanside's program on.
2	Loma Alta Creek bridge preliminary design and environmental.	3/14/22 - Caltrans Cycle 6 construction grant to be submitted by June 15 deadline. 6/13/22 - As of June meeting, Final Design had not yet been awarded. Meanwhile, construction costs are skyrocketing.
3	Mainstreet Downtown Shuttle Demonstration Project	1/23/23 - The NEV Project Shuttle, which operated very successfully and was quite popular, ended on December 6, 2022, with the Council voting not to extend funding. Funding to date had come from COVID funds.

4	Oceanside's Climate Action Plan (CAP) and its Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Ordinance and Plans	11/8/21 - Planning staff reported that they recently hired additional staff and are tackling some of the implementation steps. Staff also advised there will be an update to the CAP in the next year or so and the Committee can provide input on additional active transportation measures.
5	Onward Oceanside Corridor Plan (Part of General Plan Update)	5/3/22 - The Committee submitted a comment letter on the draft Smart and Sustainable Corridors Plan, a part of the General Plan Update.
6	LCI Classes (Cycling in Traffic)	9/13/21 - In-person and on-line classes are continuing. A separate E- Bike class is now available from SDCBC, more oriented to kids.
7	Coast Highway Road Diet and Incentive Zone	8/22/22 - California Coastal Commission staff has yet to respond to comments the City provided nearly two months ago. City staff will formally address project status at the next standing meeting with CCC staff, which happens in early October.
8	Kelly Street Bike Bridge	5/3/22 - Based on recent conversations with SANDAG representative on the Comprehensive Multi-Modal Corridor Plan process for North County, cross-I-5 connections for cycling and walking are included in that study effort and should be pursued there.
9	SANDAG's 5 Big Moves and their 2021 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)	1/23/23 - The Comprehensive Multi-Modal Corridor Plan for north county was released for public comment. The draft Plan includes recommendations to complete the IRT and CRT segments in Oceanside during the first phase of the Plan (2025 - 2030). The Committee will consider a comment letter at its Feb. 27, 2023 meeting.
10	SLR River trail ownership and improvement issues	2/20/23 - Per recent article in the San Diego U-T, the City and Army Corps have agreed on funding for the SLR channel dredging project. Per quote from the Public Works Director, it could be 10 years before the project is completed.
11	El Corazon Park Trail System	2/20/23 - The Chairman and Public Outreach Officer have submitted comments related to transportation and access to the City regarding preliminary plan layouts for Park Site 1.
12	Annual Capital Improvement Program Projects	1/23/23 - As of this date, Bike and Ped budget remains funded at \$175K, to cover Coordinator and other projects/matches
13	Coastal Rail Trail Segment between Morse and Eaton	11/14/22 - Caltrans Grant application to study alignment options was approved for this CRT project, with conditions. This alignment and feasibility study has begun.
14	Loma Alta Creek bridge and connections final design & construction	11/14/22 - The grant application was again turned down by Caltrans; however, Caltrans allocated a separate pot of funding to SANDAG to use for projects that did not make the cut, and staff believes the City has a good chance of getting those funds for this project.
15	Inland Rail Trail	8/22/22 - Staff to seek a debrief from Caltrans on the third grant denial, and City staff is preparing to resubmit a fourth time, and will cite the CMCP's stated importance of the IRT's completion.
16	Berkeley Study of problematic intersections on Oceanside Blvd.	5/3/22 - Problematic locations are Crouch, El Camino, and College. Staff to provide an update on implementation of recommendations from the study when available.
17	Oceanside Transit Center Redevelopment Project	1/23/23 - The Committee submitted a letter on our comments and concerns about the proposed project to the City, NCTD, and SANDAG. Follow-up meetings with SANDAG, City, and NCTD have since been held. The Chairman submitted a follow-up letter with further comments and recommendations on 2/1/23 and and attended and spoke at the CEQA scoping meeting.
