No.	Project/Program	Status Updates
1	BikeShare Programs: -Coastal cities' joint BikeShare/ScooterShare programs -SANDAG's guidelines development -Oceanside's ordinance	01/10/22 - B-Cycles (subsidiary of Trek) kicked off their e-bike Bikeshare program in Encinitas on January 5, 2022. Bike "dock" stations are at various locations in the City.
2	Bike Storage Facility grant implementation.	9/13/21 - Complete - 21 people have applied for membership to date.
3	Loma Alta Creek bridge preliminary design and environmental.	3/14/22 - Environmental and preliminary engineering were completed as of this date; City is amending their contract with Dokken to include final design. Caltrans Cycle 6 construction grant to be submitted by June 15 deadline.
4	Mainstreet Downtown Shuttle Demonstration Project	3/14/22 - City is willing to fund a neighborhood EV program. Using a company called FRED. Runs 12 hours a day, 7 days a week for 6 months. It has a passenger charge of \$3. It runs Vista Way to Harbor.

On-Going Projects/Programs/Discussion Items

5	Oceanside's Climate Action Plan (CAP) and its Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Ordinance and Plans	11/8/21 - Planning staff reported that they recently hired additional staff and are tackling some of the implementation steps. Staff also advised there will be an update to the CAP in the next year or so and the Committee can provide input on additional active transportation measures.
6	Onward Oceanside Corridor Plan (Part of General Plan Update)	5/3/22 - The Committee submitted a comment letter on the draft Smart and Sustainable Corridors Plan, a part of the General Plan Update.
7	LCI Classes (Cycling in Traffic)	9/13/21 - In-person and on-line classes are continuing.
8	Coast Highway Road Diet and Incentive Zone	2/9/22 - Planning staff reports that the Incentive District is still mired in the California Coastal Commission Certification Review Process; staff does not see a certification hearing occurring before May or June.
9	Kelly Street Bike Bridge	5/3/22 - Based on recent conversations with SANDAG representative on the Comprehensive Multi-Modal Corridor Plan process for North County, cross-I-5 connections for cycling and walking are included in that study effort and should be pursued there.
10	SANDAG's 5 Big Moves and their 2021 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP)	5/3/22 - With the RTP adopted in December, our best hope to have any influence on SANDAG's decision making is probably through participation in the Comprehensive Multi-Modal Corridor Plan process, and by continuing to submit grant applications to Caltrans. The City's Interim City Manager stated at the 4/13/22 Budget Workshop that the City would submit for the IRT Alignment Study a fourth time.
11	SLR River trail ownership and improvement issues	3/15/21 - Dir of Public Works said property not likely to be transferred to the City for a long time. Slurry seal is ok but more permanent fixes may be problematic due to ownership issues. City is potentially liable for suits in event of serious accident.
12	El Corazon Park Trail System	
13	Annual Capital Improvement Program Projects	6/14/21 - As of this date, Bike and Ped budget remains funded at \$170K, to cover Coordinator and other projects/matches
14	Coastal Rail Trail Segment between Morse and Eaton	5/3/22 - Caltrans Grant application to study alignment options was approved for this CRT project, with conditions. Requires more outreach and equity work.
15	Loma Alta Creek bridge and connections final design & construction	5/3/22 - Grant resubmittal due June 15.
16	Inland Rail Trail	5/3/22 - Caltrans Grant application to study alignment options was denied for the third time. Staff to seek a debrief from Caltrans.
17	Berkeley Study of problematic intersections on Oceanside Blvd.	5/3/22 - Problematic locations are Crouch, El Camino, and College. Staff to provide an update on implementation of recommendations from the study when available.
