Free to riders, who use App or flag down Demonstration Project vehicle. Ridership has been excellent. **On-Going Projects/Programs/Discussion Items** 11/8/21 - Planning staff reported that they recently hired additional staff Oceanside's Climate Action Plan (CAP) and are tackling some of the implementation steps. Staff also advised and its Transportation Demand 5 there will be an update to the CAP in the next year or so and the Management (TDM) Ordinance and Committee can provide input on additional active transportation Plans measures. Onward Oceanside Corridor Plan (Part 5/3/22 - The Committee submitted a comment letter on the draft Smart 6 of General Plan Update) and Sustainable Corridors Plan, a part of the General Plan Update. 9/13/21 - In-person and on-line classes are continuing. A separate E-7 LCI Classes (Cycling in Traffic) Bike class is now available from SDCBC, more oriented to kids. 8/22/22 - California Coastal Commission staff has yet to respond to Coast Highway Road Diet and Incentive comments the City provided nearly two months ago. City staff will 8 Zone formally address project status at the next standing meeting with CCC staff, which happens in early October. 5/3/22 - Based on recent conversations with SANDAG representative on the Comprehensive Multi-Modal Corridor Plan process for North 9 Kelly Street Bike Bridge County, cross-I-5 connections for cycling and walking are included in that study effort and should be pursued there. 8/22/22 - Brian Lane and Chris Kluth of SANDAG presented a report on the Comprehensive Multi-Modal Corridor Plan for north county. The SANDAG's 5 Big Moves and their 2021 10 draft Plan will include recommendations to complete the IRT and CRT Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) segments in Oceanside during the first phase of the Plan (2025 - 2030). Public input on the Plan will be sought in October. 3/15/21 - Dir of Public Works said property not likely to be transferred SLR River trail ownership and to the City for a long time. Slurry seal is ok but more permanent fixes 11 improvement issues may be problematic due to ownership issues.
